

Mothers' Union Lottery (Raffle draw): Full Terms and Conditions:

These Terms and Conditions are the Lottery Rules (Raffle Draw). By entering the lottery/raffle, entrants agree to be bound by these rules.

This lottery is being promoted by and on behalf of Mothers' Union (the Charity).

This lottery is licensed by the Gambling Commission.

To enter the lottery, you must be resident in Great Britain and aged 16 (sixteen) or over.

All tickets shall be priced at £1.

All lottery entry sales are final and no refunds shall be made at any time. All entrants acknowledge that their payment of £1 per ticket to enter the lottery does not guarantee that they will win any prize.

The draw for the prizes will be made as published on the ticket. A list of winners will appear on our website.

If a cash prize is awarded, this will be made by cheque in the name of the entrant only.

Mothers' Union reserves the right in exceptional and unforeseen circumstances to substitute any of the non cash prizes acquired for the lottery for a similar prize at the Charity's absolute discretion.

Full payment for each ticket must be received either in the form of cash or cleared funds before the ticket can be entered into the draw. Only tickets for which full payment has been received either in the form of cash or cleared funds are eligible to win the prize.

The winners of the lottery prizes will be notified by letter.

All entrants are solely responsible for providing Mothers' Union with their accurate and up-to-date contact details and the Charity will be in no way liable for any failure or inability to contact any entrant due to any errors, omissions or inaccuracies in the contact details that the entrant has provided. In the event that an entrant changes their contact details, they will be solely responsible for advising the Charity of the change.

By accepting the prize, the winner agrees to take part in promotional activity and the Charity reserves the right to use the name and region of the winner, their photograph and audio and/or visual recordings of them in any publicity unless prior notification has been received. However the Charity will endeavor to make prior contact with the player to confirm they are happy for this to happen.

Mothers' Union shall not be liable to the entrants for any loss or damage suffered or arising from:-

- any delays or failures in the postal service or other delivery methods used by the Charity or the entrants from time to time.
- any delays or failures in any software or other systems used by the Charity for the administration of the lottery
- any delays or failures in the Banking system used by the Charity or the entrants.
- any refusal by the Charity to accept registration of an individual as an entrant or the cancellation of an entrant.
- any failure to enter a chance into the draw because of any event beyond the reasonable control of the Charity

Nothing within these terms and conditions shall create or should be construed as creating any form of contract between any entrant and the Charity.

Any complaints relating to the lottery should be sent in writing to Mothers' Union giving full details of the complaint and supporting documentation.

The Charity is committed to protecting the entrants' privacy. Data that is collected from the member is used lawfully in accordance with the Data Protection Act 1998 and is used for the purpose of processing lottery chances, subsequent entry into the lottery draw, and informing winners that they have won a prize.

Players may be added to the charity database unless they expressly request otherwise via the opt-out tick box on the Lottery media or contacting the Charity.

Any entrant has the right to access the information held about them. To obtain this information, please contact the Charity in writing.

The Charity will never sell, rent or grant access of any personal data to any third party.

In the event of any dispute regarding the rules, the decision of the Charity shall be final and no correspondence or discussion shall be entered into.

The Charity reserves the right to amend these rules at any time. If the Charity does this, it will publish the amended rules on its website.

The Charity reserves the right to disqualify any entrant if it has reasonable grounds to believe the entrant has breached any of these rules.

The individual responsible for the promotion of the lottery is Daniel McAllister.

Neither the Charity nor our lottery management company shall be liable to you in contract, tort, and negligence or otherwise for any indirect or consequential loss suffered by you in relation to your participation in the Lottery (including loss of the opportunity to enter the Lottery and/or the chance of winning a prize).

Each entrant should retain a copy of these Terms and Conditions for their reference.

This lottery is a form of gambling. Participants are encouraged to gamble sensibly. Should gambling become a problem we recommend you contact the BeGambleAware.

The Laws of England and Wales shall govern the interpretation and/or enforcement of these Terms and Conditions and the Charity and all entrants hereby submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the English courts.
