# Monday: Discipleship that Transforms

Opening words – Oh Lord, just as the lives of men and women in the Bible were transformed as they experienced Your living presence, so may we be changed as we encounter You a fresh today.

<sup>3</sup> May the righteous be glad and rejoice before God; may they be happy and joyful. <sup>4</sup> Sing to God, sing in praise of his name, . . . ; rejoice before him—his name is the LORD. <sup>19</sup> Praise be to the Lord, to God our Savior, who daily bears our burdens. <sup>20</sup> Our God is a God who saves; from the Sovereign LORD comes escape from death. <sup>26</sup> Praise God in the great congregation; praise the LORD in the assembly . . . . <sup>32</sup> Sing to God, you kingdoms of the earth, sing praise to the Lord, <sup>35</sup> You, God, are awesome in your sanctuary; . . . God . . . gives power and strength to his people. Praise be to God! Psalm 68:3-4, 19-20, 26, 32, 35\*
