HINTS AND TIPS

for a successful Jubilee Quiz



Quizzes are always good fun and easy to organise. We've done the hard work for you by providing 50 Royal related questions. A mixture of hard and easy. So, how well do you know the Royal Family?

Recruit your quiz host

This is a good one to get out of the way early. Recruit your quiz host. This is someone who is comfortable reading out the questions in front of an audience. It could be more than one person if you want to split the questions up between two or more people. Just be sure everyone knows which questions they are reading out to avoid confusion. It's a good idea to practice reading the questions aloud so you are aware of any words you're finding difficult. A slight re-wording of the questions could help with this.

Location

You can host your Jubilee Quiz pretty much anywhere, with permission such as at your local pub, community centre, your local Mothers' Union branch, church etc.

Things you will need

You will need the questions sheet, the answer sheet (keep this hidden) and sheets for your quizzers to write the answers down on. We've provided all of this, so you can simply print it all out. You will also need some pens or pencils to hand out. Depending on the number of people attending or location of your quiz you may need a microphone and amplifier, or perhaps just someone with a loud voice! It's good to have a prize for the winner. Try asking a local business to donate a prize.

Decide the format

We estimate the quiz will take between 1 to 1½ hours. It might be a good idea to split the quiz into two and have a little break in the middle. People may want to play in teams or on their own, and may provide you with their quiz team names. Make sure you ask people to turn off their mobile phones.

Pricing

As part of the Jubilee Summer of Hope campaign, decide if you want to charge people to take part in the quiz. If so, set the price that best suits your community. Instead of a fixed entry fee you could ask people to make a donation, just make sure you have access to a collection tin.

Publicise

Once you have confirmed your quiz host, location and any entry charge, decide on the date and time and then get the word out. There's a poster you can print out here with space to add the date, time and location of your Jubilee Quiz. Put some up at your branch, church, community centre, pub – anywhere you think they'll get seen. Don't forget to ask your local shops if they'll put one up in their window. Social media is a great way of publicising your quiz as well. If you're not sure how to use it, ask family and friends to help. Best of all is word of mouth! Start chatting to people to let them know about your quiz, where it is and when it is and what the entry charge or suggested donation is. People can't come unless they know about it.

Ask for help

If you unsure of anything ask advice from a friend who has experience in hosting quizzes.
