Brief History of Mothers' Union

Mothers' Union was founded in 1876 by Mary Sumner, who was married to an Anglican clergyman and lived in the village of Old Alresford, England. Initially, Mary Sumner set up MU to empower fellow mothers in her parish, believing that strong families were essential for a stable society.



We work under three core pillars to help communities transform:







Throughout our history, MU has remained dedicated to our mission to demonstrate our Christian faith by contributing to the sustainable transformation of communities 'around the corner and around the world.' We embody our faith by work to end violence, end injustice and end poverty. Our vision is a world where everyone prospers. We actively pursue this vision through prayer and action, helping to build confident people and resilient communities. Our movement seeks to bring about justice, challenge prejudice and advocate change.

We are the largest and oldest women's organisation advocating and working for social justice wherever we see the need in our communities. We are a part of the communities we serve – and have been since 1876. Not only that, but our movement is the largest volunteer-led network in the Anglican Communion. In 2026, we are celebrating our 150th anniversary as a global movement with 4 million members in 84 countries.

Membership is open to all, regardless of gender, age, and marital or parental status. This enables us to impact more lives through our faith, inspired by our founder, Mary Sumner.

Our Reach and Impact

Mothers' Union is a global Christian movement working with people of all faiths and none to develop communities, strengthen families and advocate for change.

We are active in 84 countries and work tirelessly to serve communities and build a future where everyone thrives.

We are focused on ending violence, ending poverty, ending injustice.



We are transforming lives by:

- 1. Creating a peaceful and safe environment for all,
- 2. Fighting for gender justice, and
- 3. Building individuals' self-reliance.

MU Global

Through our development work, our Christian values further underpin this commitment to working towards a world that ensures everyone can live life in all its fullness. Our inclusive approach ensures we work with people of all faiths and none, focussing on the most vulnerable. As well as addressing local short-term needs, MU has developed transformational programmes including its adult literacy, kingdom savings, and community resilience work which have been contextualised using participatory listening, learning, and acting principles designed to be locally led solutions to the needs identified. We are unusual in that all the work is undertaken by members in their own communities, making our impact highly cost-effective and sustainable. We also encourage peer support and learning through province-to-province training, exchange visits and mentoring. Keeping people safe and enabling safe places to learn is a key component of our work ensuring gender equality and safeguarding is woven into all our work.

Here is a snapshot of our impact in 2023:

- We supported over 2.8 million people worldwide.
- We helped transform 569,879 lives around the world.
- Indirectly, we positively affected 2,274,597 lives globally.



 Over 50,000 women were empowered through literacy programmes, skills training, and savings groups in countries including Burundi, the Democratic Republic of Congo, Tanzania, South Sudan, and Rwanda.

MU in Britain and Ireland

Membership

- With 36,000 members in MU branches or groups or as individual diocesan members, we remain the largest volunteer network in the Anglican Church in Britain and Ireland (B&I).
- If you already have a group of members in your church, you will know the support they give to you and your church ministry and the difference they make in your local community. Thank you for supporting them and the work of MU in your local diocese.
- If you do not yet have an MU group, why not consider signing up to our new Church-based Membership, a brand-new package of resources we are developing. These will equip you with service plans and resources on family, marriage, and healthy relationships, with training materials for parishioners on discipleship and family life designed to address the challenges and opportunities that we are encountering in the twentyfirst century.

In addition, materials will be provided on MU local community outreach programmes including MU projects that help the vulnerable in local communities. For example, MU groups offer life-changing sponsored breaks for families who need them, known as AFIA (Away From It All.) We also support survivors of domestic abuse, we provide tangible support for individuals in prisons and their families, and campaign against modern day slavery and for women's empowerment. There is also the unique opportunity to fundraise for local projects and for our transformative work around the world.

Our National Programmes – Faith in Action

Each diocese has a bespoke combination of programmes based on local need and calling. This community work reflects MU's aims to end violence, end injustice and end poverty. Each programme is supported with resources to help volunteers to have a real and deep impact in the communities they serve.

Our National Programmes include:

Domestic abuse (RISE UP campaign) – We equip MU members to support victims and survivors appropriately, encouraging them to know their own local helpline, support services, support local refuge organisations and bring together secular and religious organisations to work towards ending abuse. Every diocese also observes the 16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence from November each year.

Prison work – We support the families of prisoners and those in prison by running creches and cafes during visitation and "Reading Together" initiatives where books are read simultaneously by child and prisoner. Dioceses aid those leaving prison with packs of essential items, others send Christmas cards to prisoners. Dioceses also commit to praying annually for Prisons Week, in unity with a multitude of other organisations.

AFIA (Away From It All) – Each diocese has their own fund to provide support for families facing adversity, in any form. Some dioceses have their own caravan which can be used by vulnerable families going through tough times, whilst others fund day trips for families.

Modern Slavery – Each diocese is unique in its approach to fighting modern slavery. MU has relationships with, for example, the Clewer Initiative and our members continue to raise awareness that modern slavery is real and happening throughout the UK.

Metamorphosis Bitesize – is a six-session discipleship training course for parishioners, focused on the understanding of transformation in churches and communities. Perfect for small groups, this is available from our online shop. We have just finished a pilot of a wider programme funded by the Church of England, more to follow.



You will find MU volunteers up and down B&I in hospitals, in schools, working with refugees, in foodbanks and working to support clergy in the operation of the church and the delivery of its ministry. We are present in every community, putting our faith into action.

Faith

We assist churches by helping with, amongst other things, Thy Kingdom Come (TKC), Blue Christmas, Baptism and marriage preparation, Sunday school and Messy Church, leading intercessions, or Bible studies. We are on hand to facilitate your TKC engagement with a range of dedicated resources to deepen your faith and outreach. Blue Christmas, also known as "The Service of the Longest Night" is a way of allowing parishioners to reflect on the challenges of the season and acknowledge the difficulties of life, alongside the Christmas message of hope.

Community outreach and impact in B&I

- In B&I in 2023, 68,888 benefited from our work in local communities. This includes acts of love and service.
- Dioceses in B&I provided holidays, trips, and outings to over 2,000 children and 1,000 families whose lives have been met with adversity, giving them much-needed respite and the opportunity to make happy memories.
- More than 20,000 items including clothing, bedding, care packages, handcrafted blankets and baby items were lovingly made and distributed by MU members to refugees, the homeless, hospital patients and families.
- We engaged over 15,000 people in awareness raising campaigns, vigils, marches, and outreach on issues like gender-based violence, human trafficking, parenting, relationships, and family life.
- In 2023, we launched the RISE UP Against Domestic Abuse campaign to raise awareness about domestic abuse. Working in partnership with our members we ensure that as many churches as possible have information about their local domestic abuse helpline and the help they can provide.
