



Prayers to use during the 16 days of Activism

Welcome to this collation of 16 Days and Global Day of Action prayers and resources. This material may be used in a variety of contexts e.g. in worship, as an introduction to discussion about GBV and DOMESTIC ABUSE, as inspiration for prayerful and practical action – however you choose...

Mothers' Union campaigns for an end to gender based violence, including domestic abuse. Since 2013 it has been a primary focus. In discussing transformation of lives, the World Council in Kigali in 2019 affirmed three main goals for the future – *to transform lives by creating an environment that is peaceful and safe for all, where livelihoods are secure and where gender justice is a reality.*

Women and girls face many injustices. As members of Mothers' Union, we play a unique role in helping to overcome this across the world. Our 16 Days campaign has evolved into a dedicated 16 Days 365 outreach. Initiatives undertaken aim to develop understanding of the root causes of gender based violence, draw attention to unhelpful cultural norms, promote right and equal relationships, and highlight domestic abuse in our communities. We also work with other organisations and groups to increase our effectiveness.

The statistics are staggering. In 2018, two church studies¹ show that in Britain and Ireland figures are equally high in a church setting, with 1 in 3 women and 1 in 4 men reporting that they had personally experienced or witnessed domestic abuse. Most church goers indicated they had never heard a sermon on the topic, or felt their church was inadequately equipped to support or deal with the issue of domestic abuse.

It is hoped this latest compilation will equip, encourage and empower you on your prayerful and spiritual journey, as we seek to bring into focus God's continuing love and work together as the hands and feet of Christ in the eradication of all forms of gender-based violence.

Global Day Creative Prayer Ideas 2020

Inspired by God's Word

This idea could work well when holding a vigil. When each prayer is shared a candle could be lit as a symbol of God's light overcoming the darkness.

Provide Bible verses connected with aspects of domestic abuse on pieces of card or paper – there are some examples in this resource but feel free to use your own ideas. Give people opportunity to choose a card and then have a time of quiet for each to reflect on their verse.

Then take turns to use your verse for prayer. Each read out their verse and then either finish with Lord in your mercy, hear our prayer or if people are confident, speak out their own prayer arising from their reflection.





This idea could be combined with the use of a prayer tree with the verses hung on a tree after being shared.

Prayer Tree

Provide a prayer tree along with labels for people to write their prayers on and hang on the tree. If you can participate in a service, you could bring the tree forward in the service and offer up the prayers as part of the intercessions.

Or you could use the same idea as part of an event.

Instead of the thorn-bush will grow the juniper, and instead of briers the myrtle will grow. This will be for the Lord's renown, for an everlasting sign, that will endure for ever. *Isaiah 55:13*

Day 8

Do not fear, for I am with you. Do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you. I will uphold you with my righteous right hand. *Isaiah 41:10*

God of righteousness, we pray against regimes that endorse violence against women and girls. Replace their evil influence with a rule of justice and decency. Amen

Day 9

God will give a crown of beauty for ashes, a joyous blessing instead of mourning, festive praise instead of despair. *Isaiah 61:3 (NLT)*

Transforming God, we pray for all who live in fear of violence and despair that life will ever change. Bring to an end their suffering; restore their sense of worth. Amen

Day 10

Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, 'Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?' And I said, 'Here am I. Send me!' *Isaiah 6:8*

Holy Spirit fill us with new resolve to challenge unacceptable mindsets and actions and to champion the cause of righteousness in the name of Christ. Amen

Day 11

Then the king will answer, "The truth is, anything you did for any of my people here, you also did for me."





Matthew 25:40 (ERV)

Lord Jesus be with those who work with survivors of gender-based violence. May they be given the resources they need to offer long lasting support. Amen

Day 12

Jesus said: Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. Therefore, whoever takes the lowly position of this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven. And whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me. *Matthew* 18:3-5

Heavenly Father protect children who witness violence in the home. May they be given support to enable them to lead positive lives, in freedom from fear. Amen

Day 13

Don't copy the behaviour and customs of this world, but let God transform you into a new person by changing the way you think. *Romans 12:2 (NLT)*

All-powerful God break the patterns of abuse committed down the generations. Transform attitudes and behaviour for current and future relationships. Amen

Day 14

Endow the king with your justice, O God, the royal son with your righteousness. May he judge your people in righteousness, your afflicted ones with justice. *Psalm 72:1-2*

Lord of the nations, we pray for governments as they deal with gender-based violence. May they make policy and law with wisdom and discernment. Amen

Day 15

Don't take part in doing those worthless things that are done in the dark. Instead, show how wrong they are. The light will show what these things are really like. *Ephesians 5:11, 13*

Merciful God bless those working with perpetrators of gender-based violence. Give them your resources to bring about lasting transformation of lives. Amen

Day 16

There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus. *Galatians 3:28*





Lord of heaven and earth, we pray for all to follow Christ's example of treating women with equality and respect. We pray for the dawn of a better world where justice and peace may flourish. Amen
