RISE UP Service Outline Template

This service outline may be used and adapted for a variety of contexts. You could ask your local church to use this as a basis of their service during 16 Days (or another time) or just use the **RISE UP** pledge and final prayer. You could use this to hold your own diocesan or branch service.

As people arrive give them a square piece of paper to make an origami dove before the service begins.

Welcome and call to worship

Welcome to our service which is part of Mothers' Union's RISE UP Against Domestic Abuse campaign to raise awareness about domestic abuse.

The letters of RISE UP stand for Respond, Inform, Support, Empower, Unite and Pray.

As we raise our voices on behalf of the voiceless, we also raise our voices in worship and intercession to our loving righteous God.

I love the Lord because he hears my voice and my prayer for mercy. Because he bends down to listen, I will pray as long as I have breath! Psalm 116:1-2 (NLT)





Respond

We pray for God's compassion as we seek to **RESPOND** appropriately to those who may disclose domestic abuse, we draw near in faith to the Lord who draws near to us with love and hears our prayers for mercy:

Lord, give us eyes to see and ears to hear the many different ways in which domestic and family violence is carried out against all sorts of people, in all sorts of ways, in our communities. Thank you that you see and you hear everything that happens in this world. Give us understanding and keep us vigilant to recognise those who need assistance, knowing that violence does not always involve physical scarring and bruising. Give counsellors and pastoral care workers understanding and wisdom as they offer support in these painful circumstances.

Amen.

Hymn Homily

Share this message from Dr Hannah Thompson, Church of England National Safeguarding Learning and Development Manager:

'Domestic abuse is the most prevalent form of abuse within our society, and the church plays an important part in recognising and responding to this complex social problem that impacts people, communities and services across our society, spanning health, housing, social care, the Criminal Justice System and beyond.

'Church should be a source of support for people experiencing abuse, but it all too often creates barriers and difficulties.

'A recent study undertaken in partnership with Mothers' Union and the national safeguarding team highlighted we still have some way to go to ensure anyone experiencing domestic abuse feels safe and supported by their church community. As in some cases "domestic abuse is not considered a subject to be talked about in the Church to which I belong"

'As Church we want our communities to feel able to recognise and refer individuals to services that can provide the specialist support.'

Then encourage those present to reflect on how they might personally *RISE UP* and support their branch or church to achieve the Bronze award:

- 1. Put a RISE UP poster raising awareness about domestic abuse in an appropriate public place such as in churches, toilets, community centres, village halls etc.
- 2. Commit to pray for those affected by domestic abuse, including the victims, survivors, perpetrators, and those who work in the field of domestic abuse.
- 3. Make a connection with your local domestic abuse support organisation to see how you can support them. You could offer moving in and moving on packages.





Support

We pray for God's gentleness as we try to **SUPPORT** those who have experience of abuse, those whose loved ones have experience of abuse.

Intercessions

Loving Lord, hear our cries for justice and break the chains of abuse that all may live in safety.

Loving Lord, hear our cries for righteousness and break the chains of oppression that all may live in freedom

We take a moment in the quiet to bring our own prayers to God.

Loving Lord, hear our cries for mercy and break the chains of fear that all may live in peace. **Amen**

Empower

Ask those present to write their personal pledge to *RISE UP* on their origami dove. These could be collected and brought to the front, ready to be displayed somewhere after the service.

The RISE UP pledge is a call to action, an invitation, a voluntary choice and opportunity to affirm our commitment to end domestic violence.

Taking the pledge says that our Mothers' Union branch/church will help end domestic violence by pledging to support the Mothers' Union RISE UP Challenge by committing to pray regularly, for victims of domestic abuse throughout the whole world.
