




Building on hope and success

So far in the DRC, Mothers' Union is running Literacy Circles in four dioceses. In the past two years, 2,635 participants have joined the programme.

Over the next two years, we plan to:

- Continue delivering Literacy Circle support in these four dioceses, reaching a further 4,800 direct participants there
- Start new Literacy Circles in four more dioceses – Boga, Kisangani, Bukavi and Goma, reaching 4,800 more participants.
