Shannon, who is just 13 years old, often missed a week of school per month because she didn't have adequate protection at the time of her period. This resulted in her having to drop out of school and risk getting pregnant at a young age, which can be dangerous for several reasons. With little access to education and employment, her family is more likely to live in poverty.

However, by raising money through the Mothers' Union Christmas Raffle, you could help to support the production of sanitary kits that include pads, knickers and soap, given for free to women and girls who can't afford to buy disposable sanitary pads.

Each kit is produced through a partnership between the Mothers' Union Parenting Programme in Guyana and a local project called Days for Girls.
